CAMPING RULES

ALL PERMITS ARE SUBJECT TO CANCELLATION OR TERMINATION BY THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU. The City may revoke a permit and/or stop a use in progress if the permit holder fails to comply with applicable City ordinances, including Revised Ordinances of Honolulu Chapter 10, the Amended camping Policy, Rules and Regulations Governing camping at City Parks of the Department of Parks and Recreation, or the terms and conditions of the permit.

DAMAGES: Permit holder shall be liable for loss, damage or injury to persons or property resulting from permit holder's use of the park or park facility under such permit, as well as any breach of City regulations or ordinances, to the person or persons suffering such loss, damage, or injury, and to the City in the event the City shall become liable for such damage or injury.

Permit holder shall comply with and be bound by all applicable federal and state laws, City ordinances, including Revised Ordinances of Honolulu Chapter 10, and the Amended Camping Policy, Rules and Regulations Governing camping at City Parks, as though the same were incorporated into such permit, including the following:

1. A valid permit shall be in the possession of the permit holder or their authorized representative at all times and shall be exhibited to any authorized Department personnel or police officer upon request.
2. **NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ALLOWED.** Possessing alcoholic beverages is prohibited in all parks.
3. Camping is permitted only in numbered campsites and/or in areas designated by signs for camping. Please camp at least 50 feet away from adjoining property boundaries.
4. Camping areas shall be kept cleared of litter and trash at all times, and refuse shall be placed in proper containers.
5. The kindling, building, or maintaining of campfires is prohibited except in fire pits and campfire rings provided by the City and County. Charcoal fires may be allowed in grills and braziers for cooking purposes. If private barbeque stoves are used, they must be at least 12 inches above the ground and kept well away from tree trunks, plants, and structures.
6. When a permit holder vacates a camping area, the permit holder shall restore the camping area to its original condition except for ordinary wear and tear.
7. Each permit allows for a maximum of 10 people, 3 cars, and 2 tents. Maximum tent size is 15x11 feet.
8. Use of the Department's electricity for lights, appliances, etc., or hookup for water in connection with camping is prohibited.
9. Do not wash dishes or equipment in shower rooms or open shower areas.
10. No driving or parking on the grass.
11. Special care shall be taken in order that trees, shrubs, and vines are not damaged or destroyed. Nails, screws, or spikes shall not be driven into trees, plants, or structures.
12. All vehicles must have a permit that allows them to park in designated areas in certain parks.
13. Waterslides and bouncers are prohibited at all campgrounds.
14. No camping on Wednesdays or Thursdays. All campgrounds shall be closed to camping beginning on Wednesday at SAM and continue until SAM Friday.
15. Permits cannot be changed, altered, sold, or transferred once they are issued.

Violations of rules may result in a fine of up to \$500 and/or revocation of your camping permit.
